

Jacaranda / Black Poui (Common Name)



Jacaranda mimosifolia (Scientific Name)

PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS

Canopy potential: 20' – 30' wide

Annual Growth Rate: 24"

Powerline Friendly: 40' – 50' from base

Root Damage Potential: Low

Leaves: Large, leaves to 20 inches long, on coarse green brittle stems.

Flowers: Clusters of wonderful, terminal, large showy, tubular, lilac-blue flowers.

Tree Care: Plant in full sun in well-drained soil. While drought tolerant, irrigate and water in the summer months or dry months.

Ecosystem Services: Flowers of the tree are used as medicinal treatments and have been attributed with anti-inflammatory, anti-parasitic, anti-fungal, and antioxidant properties. Hot leaf baths have been used to treat wounds and skin infections.
